Safety planning and security upgrades for women and children experiencing domestic and family violence to stay in their homes

KEEPING WOMEN SAFE IN THEIR HOMES

Keeping Women Safe in Their Homes is a program designed to undertake risk assessment, safety planning and security upgrades for women and children experiencing domestic and family violence so that they can stay in their own homes, or a home of their choice, where it is safe to do so.

The program aims to achieve positive outcomes for families, women and their children to improve safety, well-being and reduce violence against women and their children.

WHAT SORT OF SERVICES CAN WE PROVIDE?

- Conduct comprehensive risk assessments, including the option for improved safety of their home as a response of domestic violence
- Undertake safety planning, property audits and technology risk assessments as part of a comprehensive case management plan
- Implement security upgrades in line with the risk assessment to secure the home
- Provide information, support and referrals to relevant service providers

WHAT SECURITY UPGRADES CAN WE PROVIDE?

Property security measures such as:

- Change locks on doors and windows
- Provision and installation of security screens
- Provision and installation of dead locks to exit doors
- Provision and installation of gate locks
- Access to new phone equipment
- Individual responses to identified risks identified as part of the risk assessment

HOW DO I ACCESS THIS PROGRAM?

- Contact the Keeping Women Safe in Their Homes program (self or agency referrals accepted)
- Undertake intake process and assessment of safety needs
- Case Manager assesses risk vulnerability
- Safety concerns are identified and an action plan is developed
- Immediate works commence on property
- Individual case management plan prepared with Case Manager and client
- Review property works and reassess safety of clients
- If clients are in immediate danger Police will be contacted and safe accommodation arranged
- Clients who require further support in relation to their domestic and family violence circumstances will be referred to Case Managers within the YWCA Darwin Domestic and Family Violence Centre, or other appropriate services
